The Pandora Alarm Studio application allows you to change the main settings and parameters of the system, update firmware, download installation manuals, connect to the server to make CLONE procedure.

Working with the Pandora Alarm <u>Studio</u>

A current version of the Pandora AlarmStudio can be downloaded from pandorainfo.com. The Pandora AlarmStudio is provided only to authorized installers of Pandora systems.

Download the Pandora AlarmStudio to a PC with Windows XP/Vista/7/8/10. Run the Pandora AlarmStudio; Connect the system to the PC via a USB cable; • Put the system to the programming mode; • The Pandora AlarmStudio will automatically connect to the system and you will be able to configure settings and update firmware. It is recommended to update firmware of the base unit before installing and programming the system:
